Biography Information

During the graduation ceremony, as your graduate walks up to receive his/her diploma, a speaker will read your student's biography out loud.

Please create a short biography for your graduate, no more than 110 words, from a third person point of view. The purpose of the bio is to honor your child and his/her accomplishments, which will also, secondarily, give the audience a positive image of homeschooling. Parents and students should please consider writing the bio jointly so that both of you will feel comfortable with what is being read that night.

We understand that you want to celebrate the uniqueness of your child, but please do so in such a way that it will not embarrass them or sound boastful to the audience. Some things that you could include are:

- > how many siblings
- > favorite hobbies what they like to do in spare time
- special memory with family or NJHSA
- > awards
- > future plans

You can practice your creative writing by making the narrative flow smoothly. Following are some examples of a successful biography. Please keep to the word limit as the Bio Secretary will have to edit it if it is significantly over the limit (a few words is fine).
